

## Caledonia County Democrats Elect New Officers

St. Johnsbury – At their October caucus, the Caledonia County Democrats elected a new slate of officers and delegates to represent them for the next two years. St. Johnsbury resident Issiah Wilson was elected as Chair; Bruce Maclean from Peacham is Vice Chair; Marion Mohri, St. Johnsbury, is Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer Mildred Lebeur, Danville; and Wheelock resident Eileen Bolland will again serve as Secretary.
